

Oscar Mpetha, born in 1909, is probably South Africa's oldest political prisoner. Despite suffering from diabetes and having lost a leg through gangrene, he remains incarcerated in Cape Town's Pollsmoor prison – serving a five year sentence for 'terrorism'.

He was convicted of terrorism after the apartheid court heard how he encouraged youths to sing a song about fetching weapons from Angola. Whilst on bail he was elected President of the United Democratic Front and the Release Mandela Committee. Both are now banned.

Offered release by Pretoria in July, 1988 if he rejected the armed struggle against apartheid, the 79 year old trade unionist refused to compromise. Such 'freedom' would have confined Oscar to a Cape Town magisterial district with 24 hour surveillance and prevented him from attending public meetings or talking to journalists.

Oscar has been involved in the democratic trade union movement since 1925. At the age of 71, he was appointed national organiser of the Food and Canning Workers Union and helped the union re-establish itself nationally until his arrest in 1980. Oscar's record in the democratic movement in South Africa is second to none. He has fought for a non-racial and democratic South Africa for over 60 yrs. The President of the Congress of South African Trade Unions, Elija Barayi, describes Oscar as the father of South African trade unionism. Your action can help bring about Oscar's release.


