APARTHEID: THE BRITISH CONNECTION

- * African workers do the same jobs for the same companies, as workers here.
- * They receive poverty wages and have no trade union or political rights.
- * There are over 2 million black workers unemployed.
- * They are fighting back !
- * Leyland refuse trade union rights to the Metal+Allied Workers Union.
- * Barclays Bank finance the racist South African Government.
- * The South African police state use Alvis armoured cars and Rover Landrovers to repress black workers and students.

Unemployment, racism, plant closures, denial of T.U. rights, lower wages for women, police repression -- The bosses and the state use the same weapons against the working class in South Africa as here.



STOP THE SOUTH AFRICAN "BARBARIAN" RUGBY TOUR

- 8 whites, 8 coloureds, 8 blacks make up the South African team.
- Picked on the basis of race, they offer a farcical show of 'integration'
- Sport is being used as part of an international campaign to make the horror of apartheid look respectable.
- Under apartheid, integrated sports - whites and blacks competing on an equal basis - is impossible !

- * White and black players cannot use the same facilities.
- * White and black clubs cannot play each other.
- * White players have been prosecuted and convicted for attempting to play in multi-racial teams.
- * 'Unacceptable' black sportsmen and women cannot get passports to leave the country to participate in international events.
- * The Pass Laws impose severe restrictions on the movement of all black people and this includes black teams.

- These are the effects on sport of 'normal' apartheid legislation.
- On this tour, the only multi-racial rugby union in South Africa - the S.A. Rugby Union - is not represented. This team has been selected on the basis of race and excludes the leading black players, who will have no truck with it.
